9.1	3.86	2.28	3½%	88 lbs.

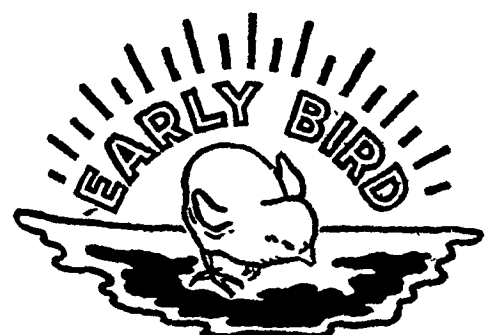

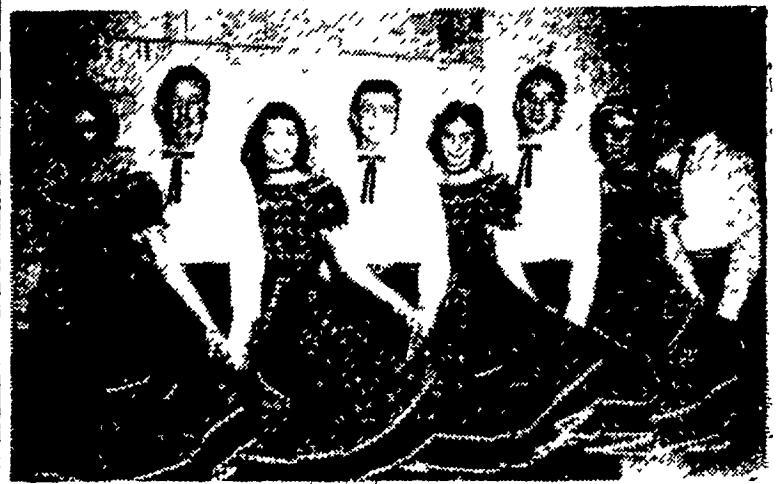

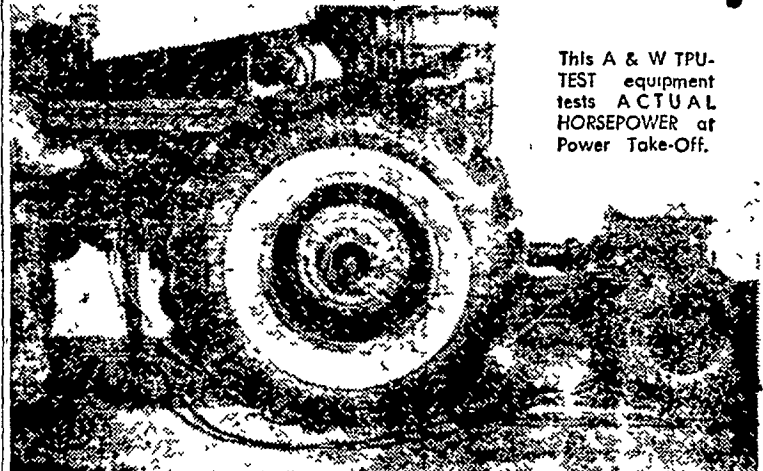
