Weed Control
Simazine and Atrazine continue to be the two chemicals recommended for control of weeds in corn, George Berggren, extension agronomist said.

Applied at planting time either in a band over the row or broadcast, these two chemicals have given good weed control. Rates of application are two to three pounds of Simazine or Atrazine per acre in 20 to 40 gallons of water. Row applications are suggested because of the cost of the material, but if row applications are used, farmers are cautioned to adjust rates of application so as not to apply the

material too heavily on any part of the soil.

Most of the spray recommendations for 1961 are included in the newest Agronomy Guide available through the county extension office, 202 Post Office building, in Lancaster.

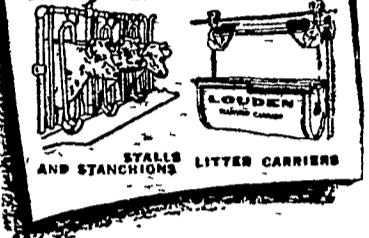
