to acreage in Pennsylvania Vegetable growers estimate the state's output of field tomatoes has declined 50 percent in the past two years.

Funk said processors complain they can not get farmers to contract to grow tomatoes because of the large amount of hand labor required to harvest the crop.

Much of the tomato acreage has shifted to California but Pennsylvania growers believe they can regain some of their former status, especially in view of recent quality problems in the California crop.

Funk said, of the 111 Pa tomato growers producing over 20 tons per acre, none were from Lancaster County

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
