Donegal Witness Oak FFA chapter plans projects for National FFA Week this year. They are going to supply place mats in two local diners, place posters and some other activities. Also, they plan to butcher several pigs and make sausage.

Membership in the FFA is made up of farm boys who are students of vocational agriculture in high school. The organization's activities are designed primarily to help develop rural leadership and good citizenship, and to stimulate the boys to better achievement in their study and work toward successful establishments in farming or other agricultural occupations.

Officers are: Larry Heistand, president; Barry Earhart, vice president; Walter Mower, secretary; Clair Mummau, treasurer; Lloyd Heisey, reporter; Ron Ober, sentinel and Glen Musser, chaplain. Harrisburg Man On PENE Staff

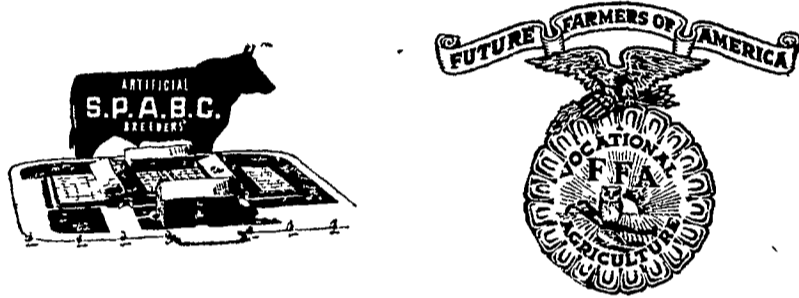
