The reason such a large quantity of water can be utilized from a relatively small area is wise use of the water, Kitch said. Through the use of three large reservoirs, most of the water falling on the area can be saved for use.

The rate of flow in the Conestoga Creek has a range of one to 3,000, Kitch pointed out. This means there is 3,000 times as much water flowing at highest period of

flow as at the time of lowest flow. If the water could be released gradually from the watershed, the range could be reduced greatly.

The district approved the applications for conservation plans of six new co-operators. The farms, in five townships, make up a total of 395 acres. Cooperators, address, townships and acreage are G. 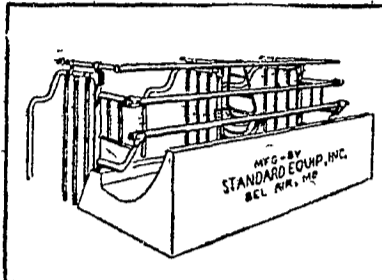
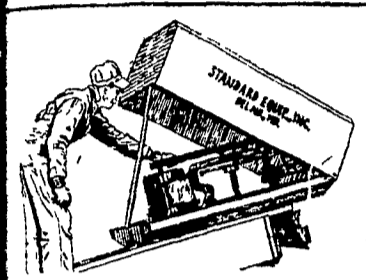

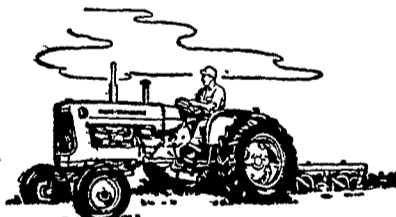
