

**Pa. Certifies  
166,576 Bu.  
Seed Potatoes**

Harrisburg, Feb 28— The Bureau of Plant Industry of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture announced today that 166,576 bushels of seed potatoes have passed certification requirements.

An actual growth test carried on this winter in Florida showed that more than 99 per cent of the seed potatoes are free of virus diseases. Rules for certification of seed potatoes require that only 97 per cent of the seed potatoes be virus-free.

Virus diseases — leaf roll, mosaic and spindle tuber — are the main reasons for "running-out" of non-certified seed potatoes. Virus infected seeds can cause a production drop of up to 40 per cent per hill of potatoes.

Field inspectors of the Bureau of Plant Industry check seed fields during the growing season to determine the extent of virus infection. The growth test in Florida acts as a further check on the disease-freedom of the seed potatoes.

Kennebec, Russet, Katahdin and Norland varieties are available as Pennsylvania-produced certified seed potatoes. County agricultural extension agents or C. F. Campbell, Bureau of Plant Industry, Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, Harrisburg, may be consulted for sources of certified seed potatoes.
