

#### FEEDING PROGRAM

Get chicks on feed as soon as they arrive. On the first day, feed either cracked corn or crumbles, but not both Feed grit the first day and twice each week thereafter. Discontinue grain after first day.

#### EARLY-BIRD FEED

#6 Early-Bird Growing Mash

Feed growing mash and oats, gradually increasing proportion of oats to 50% at 9 weeks. For Leghorns, do not feed over 50% oats in confinement, but increase to 60% on range. For heavy breeds, oat feeding at 17 weeks to maturity may be increased to

#15. Early-Bird Growing Mash

Change from #6 Growing Mash to #15 at the end of the 12th week. #15 contains no coccidiostat.

Start feeding #41 at the end of 12th week and continue as the only feed until birds are put into the laying house at 20-24 weeks of


