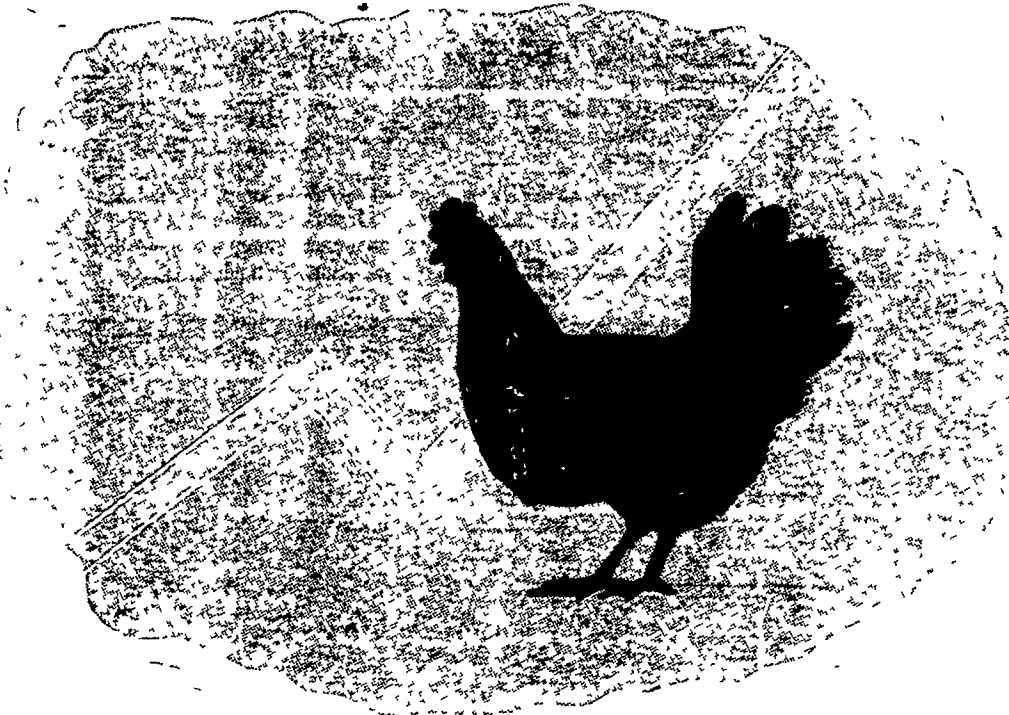


# MANAGEMENT . . .

Growth and development during the first 20 weeks determine the future productivity and profitability of your flock.



## and a GOOD FEEDING PROGRAM for replacement flocks

A delicate balance of nutritive ingredients is required to grow chicks at the proper rate of development and give them the sturdy frames necessary for prolonged periods of high production.

### STARTING PERIOD

AGE	EARLY-BIRD FEED	FEEDING PROGRAM
0-6 weeks	#3 Early-Bird Chick Starter	Get chicks on feed as soon as they arrive. On the first day, feed either cracked corn or crumbles, but not both. Feed grit the first day and twice each week thereafter. Discontinue grain after first day.

### GROWING PERIOD

#### Scratch and Mash Program

AGE	EARLY-BIRD FEED	FEEDING PROGRAM
7th week to 20th week	#6 Early-Bird Growing Mash	Feed growing mash and oats, gradually increasing proportion of oats to 50% at 9 weeks. For Leghorns, do not feed over 50% oats in confinement, but increase to 60% on range. For heavy breeds, oat feeding at 17 weeks to maturity may be increased to 66%.
	#15 Early-Bird Growing Mash	Change from #6 Growing Mash to #15 at the end of the 12th week. #15 contains no coccidiostat.

### All Mash Program

AGE	EARLY-BIRD FEED	FEEDING PROGRAM
7th week to 20th week	#32 Early Bird All Mash Growing Ration	This should be the only feed used from the 7th through 12th weeks.
	#41 Early-Bird All Mash Developer (no coccidiostat)	Start feeding #41 at the end of 12th week and continue as the only feed until birds are put into the laying house at 20-24 weeks of age.

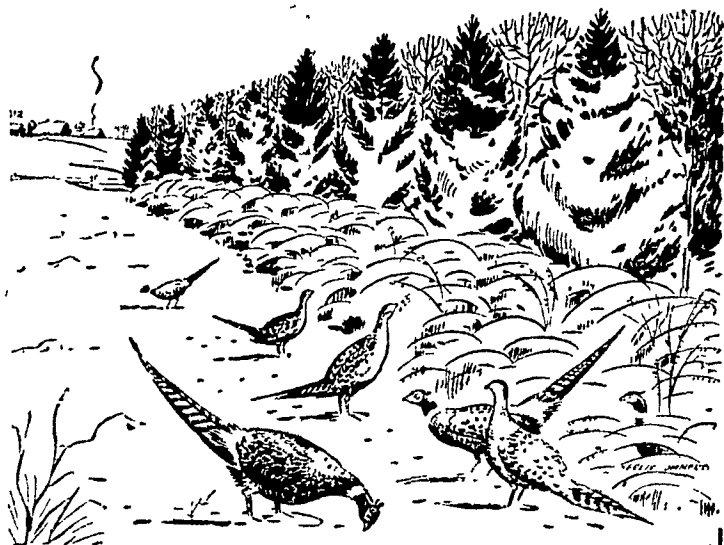
