

NEW HOLDING PENS AT VINTAGE Sales Stables should be completed in about four to six weeks. The completion of the new pens will make room for expanding receipts at the Tuesday night auctions. At present time pens must be emptied and filled again during the sale, but when the addition is completed holding pens will be empty at the start of each auction.

## Vintage Barn Additions Are Nearing Completion

Additions to the holding pens at the Vintage Sales Stables should be ready for use in four to six weeks, a spokesman for the organization said this week.

The addition of more than 50 per cent more area than is now under roof at the sales barn will make it possible to move cattle easier and faster during the weekly sale, according to Frank Dussinger, sale manager.

Dussinger said the workmen are making good progress and the new pens should be ready for use in about a month to six weeks. The auction, held each

Tuesday night, sells fat cattle, stockers and feeders, veal calves, hogs and sheep. At the sale this week a total of 1,076 head of livestock

crossed the block. Buyers at the auction represented meat packers from Philadelphia and Baltimore as well as many local butchers. Many of the light cattle going through the ring are returned to farms in the area for further finishing.

Since The U. S. Department of Agriculture Market News report began covering the Vintage sale last year sales have been steadily increasing until addition of the new pens became necessary.

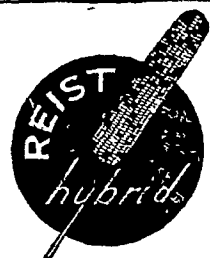

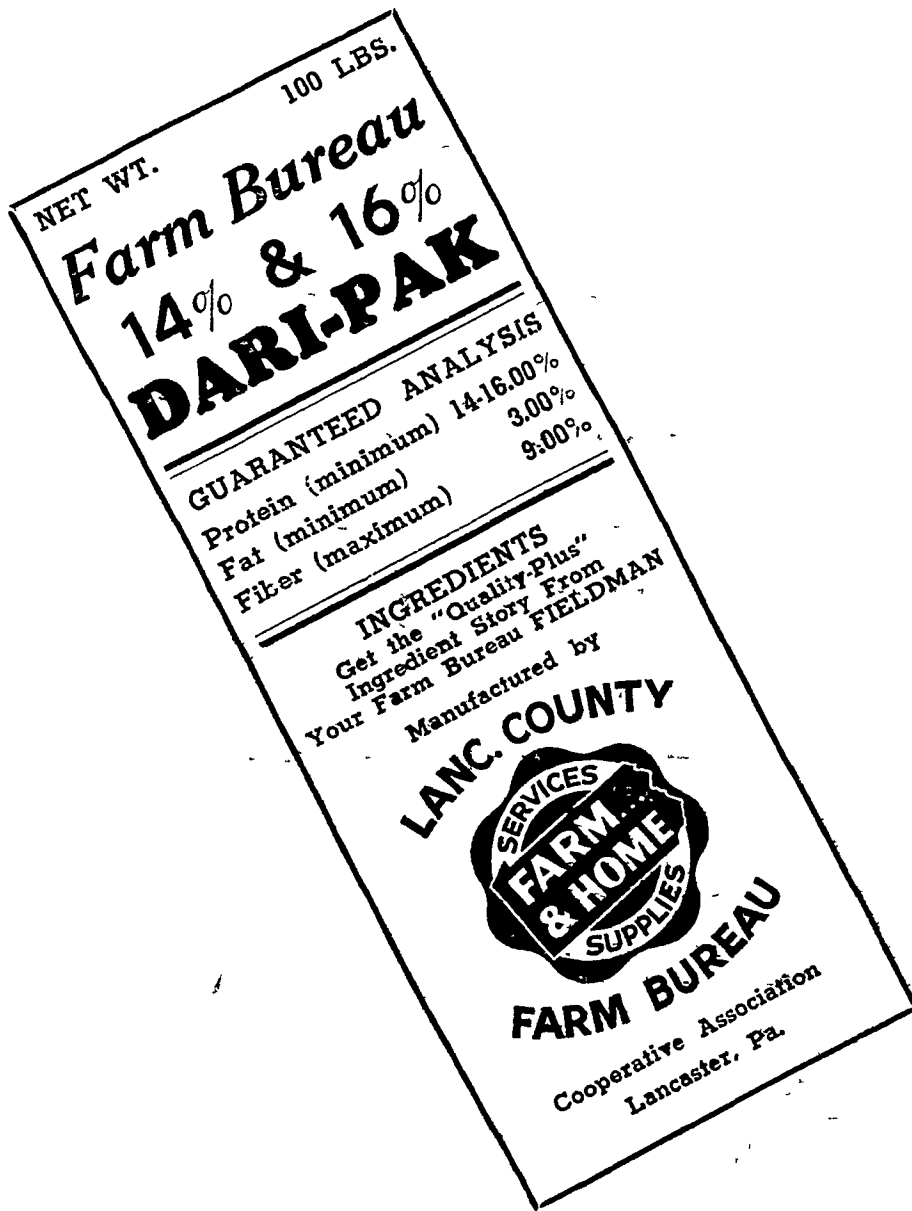
