Harrisburg - Forests and Waters Secretary Maurice K. Goodard reported today that the state has earned over \$1 million more from the sale of State Forest timber in the last six years than in the previous twenty.

"Income from timber sales since 1955, when a scientific management plan was placed in effect has brought \$2,574, 753 into the state's General Fund compared with only \$1,426,510 earned from 1935 through 1954," he stated, "proof that harvesting timber on a sustained yield management basis earns dividends" He predicted that earnings will be at least doubled in the next few






