The project, which has been under consideration by numerous agricultural interests of the county for several years, received momentum a few months ago, with the disclosure that an anonymous donor has offered a gift of \$100,000 and 10 acres of land, to help set the building program in motion. The Center will be built near the route 230 by-pass, just north of Lancaster City.

"Our fund-raising appeal will be aimed at seeking funds on a county-wide basis, now that plans for the Center are "off the ground" with a challenging leadership gift," said Noah W. Kreider, of Manheim, Chairman of the Finance Committee. Present plans, now being formulated under a Campaign Steering Committee, call for canvassing of several thousand farm families, in addition to contacting many individuals and corporate prospects within the city. Mr. Kreider stated that the appeal will be broad enough to represent sharing in the cost of the Center by many contributors, as an expression of the interest and concern people of the city and county take in making this area "The Garden Spot." Planning of the campaign is in the hands of the following men: Mr. Kreider, Mr. Esbenshade, John H. Herr, Levi H. Brubaker, Dr. E. I. Robertson, Phares S. Risser, Max M. Smith and Leshe S. Hubbard.

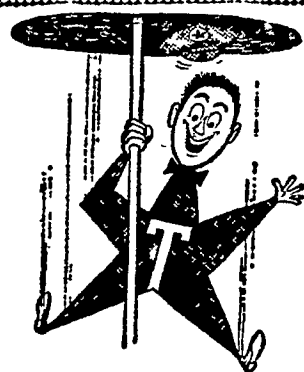
