**New Holland Slaughter Steers Gain**

Compared with last week's market, slaughter steers 25-50 higher with most advance on average Good grade and below. Cows were steady to 50 lower, bulls steady, at the May 4 sale at New Holland. Receipts were 918 cattle.

Bulk of the Choice grade slaughter steers 25.00-26.50, Good to low-Choice 22.75-25.25, Standard 21.00-22.50.

Few lots of Good grade heifers 21.00-24.00, Cutter & Utility cows 16.50-18.50, Canners and low-Cutters 15.50-16.75, shelly cannery down to 13.50.

Utility and Commercial bulls 19.50-22.85. Lot Choice 787 lb. stock steers 24.85, lot Good grade 698 lbs. 23.60.

Dairy cattle continued at steady prices at the May 3rd sale Receipts included 71 cows, 10 stock bulls and 39 stock heifers.

Fresh Holstein cows made \$300 to \$410, while Guernseys made \$175 to \$250 Other breeds were about even with Guernseys. Stock bulls sold for \$110 to \$185, and Stock heifers brought \$55 to \$180.

All kinds sold steady at the May 1 sale of horses, ponies and mules. A total of 251 head sold.

Mules by pairs ranged from \$340 to \$465, as singles sold \$130-210.

Mare ponies crossed the block at \$110-205, while geldings sold for \$45-180

Riding horses ranged from \$140-375, driving horses sold \$140-235, and killers brought 8½ to 9½ cents.
