Broilers Gain Two Cents

Broilers jumped over two cents this week at the Lancaster Poultry Center as 84,500 head in 25 lots ranged from 165 to 173 for a 16.79 average. The previous week's average was 14.99, the lowest on record for the poultry exchange.

Three lots including 3,400 pullets brought 238 to 25 while two lots of 2,100 roasters made 224 to 25.6.

Leghorn fowl brought 108 110 for the 4,500 head in three lots while 1,900 heavy fowl in three lots ranged from 135 to 141.

Delmarva - Georgia Broiler Prices One Cent Higher

Delmarva reported live broiler prices approximately one cent higher during the 24 hour period ending 10 30 Friday morning. Available offerings cleared readily and were short of processing requirements in some instances.

Prices reported on purchases at farms during the period ranged from 15.80 to 16.70 for 697,000 head.

Estimated slaughter during the week end by eastern shore processors was 698,000 head compared to the 922,000 head last week end.
