Melvin Dombach, son of Mr and Mrs Albert Dombach, Lancaster R6, the DeKalb award for general excellence, the national FFA

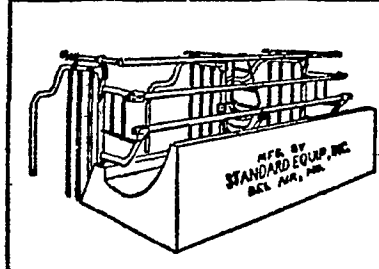
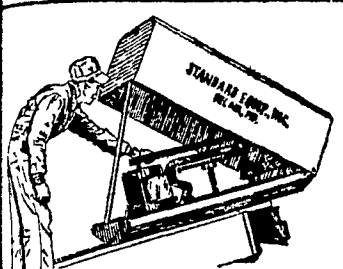
