

At Lancaster Yards Lightweights Stronger

CATTLE 3500 compared with 3143 last week Supply included 50 percent slaughter steers, 40 per cent stockers and feeders. Trading slow Slaughter steers weighing under 1200 lbs. fully steady to strong. Weights over 1200 lbs steady to 25 lower. Cows steady — 25 lower Bulls steady. Stockers and feeders steady.

Chicago Cattle Lightweights Show Gains

Weekly Review — Cattle Market receipts reduced almost 15 per cent due to Memorial Day holiday. Advances over current period were sharpest for any week since early January.

Slaughter steers average-choice and below 1-1.50 higher High commercial and prime 50-75 higher Heifers 1-1.50 higher. Utility and commercial cows 25 to fully 50 lower. Canner and cutter steady to 25 higher. Bulls 25-50 higher. Other classes unchanged.

Vintage Livestock Slaughter Steers 25-50 Higher

Receipts, at the May 30 auction at Vintage were 336 head. Compared with last week's market, slaughter steers 25-50 higher. Cows steady. Bulls 50-1 lower.

Bulk of the choice-grade slaughter steers 24-24.75, few high-choice and low-prime 24.85 25 25, good to low-choice 22.25-24, standard down to 20.75.

Cutter grade cows 17.50 - 18 50, canners 16 25-17 50, shelly canners down to 13 50 Utility and commercial bulls 19 50-22 50.

Calves: 200. Good and choice vealers 2 lower, utility and standard steady to weak. Good and choice vealers 28-36 50, standard and low-good 25-28, utility 22-25.

Hogs: 109. Barrows and gilts 25 higher. U.S. 1-3 101-217 lb. barrows and gilts 18 50-19 35, several lots 1 and 2 grade 235-243 lbs. at 18 85-19 10.

New Holland Lightweight Steers Gain

Lightweight steers were 50 higher at the June 1 auction at New Holland, Steers weighing 1,200 pounds and up were fully steady to strong. Cows steady to 50 lower. Bulls steady. Receipts were 1,322 head of cattle.

Choice slaughter steers brought 24.25 to 25.25 with a few head going to 25.75. Good to low choice made 22 25 to 24 50 while standard sold for 20.50 to 22.50.

Cutter and utility cows made 17.50 to 18 75 while canners and low cutters sold for 16 to 17 25 and shelly canners were down to 13 50 to 15.50. Utility and commercial bulls brought 19 50 to 23.

CALVES: 308. Utility grade vealers were steady while all others were down 2.00.

Good and choice vealers brought 28 to 34 with a few head to 36 Prime was absent. Standard and low good brought 24 to 28 and utility sold for 24 to 26.

The market was active on all kinds at the May 31 auc-

tion of dairy cattle. Receipts included 112 cows, 23 stock bulls and eight stock heifers. Fresh Holsteins commanded \$300 to \$470 while Guernseys brought \$175-240 and other fresh cows made \$175-280. Stock bulls made \$75 to \$180.

Draft horse and mule demand was very poor with many of this kind going to the killer trade at the May 29 auction of horses, ponies, and mules. Riding horses were in good demand and selling stronger, but the pony market was very slow. Receipts included 310 head.

Mules by the pair brought \$250-300 and singles made \$95-180. Pony mares commanded \$95-180 while geldings crossed the block at \$45-125. Riding horses brought \$135-270 and driving horses sold for \$135-225. Killers were 9½ to 10½ cents.
