Price Down, Volume Up

One of the largest sales of the year was held at the Lancaster Poultry Center this week, but the price on broilers continued to drop. Broilers at the June 1 auction sold at 13.59 avg about 1/2 cent below the previous week's average price per cent of the sales at 13.6 cents. A total of 112,230 head in 24 lots ranged in price from 13.3 to 14.6.

Heavy fowl brought 14.5 for the 1,250 head of four lots while Leghorn brought 9.4 and 9.6 for 2,900 head in two lots. A total of 4,350 pullets in lots brought 21.3 to 22.5 while straight run roasters were 20 cents for the 900 one lot. Two lots of 1,900 crested roasters brought 20 and 22.

A complete sale offered 530 head in 43 lots and 122,655 head in 38 lots. Following is the complete list with seller, grower in parenthesis, amount and average in weeks and days, per and price.

Delmarva - Georgia

Prices Average Half Cent Lower

Broilers in Delmarva averaged about a half cent lower as relatively light offerings appeared ample for the demand.

Prices paid and purchases reported in Delmarva during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning ranged from 12.90 to 13.50 on 342,700 head at farms.

Estimated slaughter for the week end was 834,000 head compared to the 900,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-fed ratio for the week ending May 26 was down two points from the previous week at 2.9. Broilers averaged 13.89 and mash cost \$95.80 per ton. For the same week a year ago the ratio was 4.0.

Fluid Milk Production Past Peak

Production continued to increase in New England and northern New York state with the middle Atlantic states holding steady at near peak levels. Southeastern areas reported a slight decrease.

Bottling demand was reported no better than fair and in the northeast heavy

diversions noted, mostly to separators, of excess supplies in New York, some whole milk was forced to move on a no handling, no transportation cost basis in an effort to locate an outlet. Some dumping of skim milk reported due to lack of handling facilities.

Wholesale selling prices at New York ranged \$4.25 to \$4.40 per 40 quart unit of bottling quality milk.
