 Fresh Holstein cows made \$300 to \$415 while Guernseys brought \$185-240 and other breeds made \$185-265. Stock bulls commanded \$95-170 and stock heifers crossed the block at \$70-160.

All mules and draft horses went to the killer trade at the June 5 horse sale. Saddle horses and killers active and in good demand. Receipts were 249 head.

Mare ponies brought \$100 to \$180 while geldings made \$50-\$140. Riding horses brought \$130-\$285 and driving horses changed hands at \$135 to \$225. Killers were 9 1/2 to 10 cents.

 steers 1,300 lbs down were 50 to 100 lower. 1,300 to 1,600 lbs. were 1 to 2 lower with most sales of choice and prime 1,400 to 1,600 lbs. 150 to 2 lower at the close. Steers standard and below steady. Heifers steady to 50 lower, most decline on wgt. over 1,000 lbs. Cows 25-50 higher, bulls 25 higher.

Most prime and mixed choice and prime 1050 to 1450 lb steers 22 25 50. Bulk choice 900 to 1,300 lb steers 22-23 late with many average to high choice 1100 to 1300 lbs 22 25-22 75. Many loads mixed good and choice at 900-1300 lbs. 21.50-22.50 when the bulk of this weight brought 20.75-22.75.

Mixed choice and prime 900 to 1050 lb. heifers brought 23 to 24. Bulk of the choice 1,000 lbs. and down were 22 50-23 50. Good at 20 75-22.25.

Commercial cows 15-17 75. Cutters 15 50-17 50. Utility and commercial bulls 18 - 21.25. Good and choice vealers 24 28.

A few good and choice 750-900 lb. feeding steers at 22-23. Few good and choice 425-495 lb. stock steer calves made 26-27.
