Second Crop Alfalfa Spray Recommended By Extension Men

The alfalfa weevil has been very erratic in feeding on the first cutting. The injury from the feeding by the weevil larvae started later than usual in most cases because of unusually low temperatures. In some cases farmers have not life Club meeting at the sprayed and have tried to harvest before the injury became severe, but this practice has usually resulted in severe damage by weevil at harvest t.me, extension agronomists say.

Will it be necessary for you to spray your second cutting alfalfa? The answer to this question will depend on the harvest time condition of your first cutting alfalfa, especially at the term-

Where alfalfa shows little Extension Service. or no injury at the terminals and few larvae are present: The weevil infestation will not be heavy enough to warrant the expense of a methoxychlor spray. Also, aphids are not likely to be present in large enough numbers to require a malathion spray.

Where alfalfa shows serious injury at the terminals and many larvae are present: It may be necessary to apply a methoxychlor spray to prevent weevil damage to the early second cutting growth. If alfalfa does not make normal regrowth for second cutting after several days, it is a good indication that weevil are feeding and regrowth. preventing the Spray immediately with two quarts of methoxychlor emulsion per acre in at least 25 gallons of water. Also, if the new growth of second cutting is chewed, it is an indication of weevil injury, and a methoxychlor spray should be applied to




