Vegetables: 8 to 12 cans or jars

Snack foods: 4 to 6 cans or jars  
A few cans on the shelf make easy entertaining. Some ideas are deviled ham, meat spreads, cocktail sausages or frankfurters, ripe olives, tiny meat balls in sauce, shrimp, crab meat, tuna and salmon.

Others: 4 to 6 cans or jars.  
Canned tomato aspic, corn relish, potato salad, potato sticks, spiced fruits, Havard and pickled beets, chocolate or fruit nut rolls, puddings, fruit pie fillings, and many

others are convenient foods, for hurry-up dinners or to make an ordinary dinner extra fancy.

Mixes have become so much a part of today's living as to be considered staple supplies. Cake mixes in single-layer size, muffin mixes in divided packages, hot roll mix which makes one loaf of bread, and the like are specially appropriate for the family of two. In addition, basic mixes for biscuits, pancakes, beverages, and the like carry label directions for measuring so as to make few or many servings of a finished product.

**BASIC TOOLS AND UTENSILS FOR THE BRIDE'S KITCHEN**

After the basic essentials have been provided, and the first additions purchased, the homemaker reaches a sky's-the-limit plateau. Here the list is endless—but to make a few: apple corer; egg slicer; melon ball cutter; kitchen shears; knife sharpener;

cookie cutters; cookie press; doughnut cutter; pastry blender; pastry canvas; bread box; cake box; spring-form pan; fish mold; canister set; spice cabinet; teapot; pressure saucepan; oven, meat, deep fat, and candy thermometers; individual molds; individual braziers; French chef's knife, slicing knife, etc.

The young homemaker's most important checkrein is the question, "Is this a really useful tool or utensil, or is it just a gadget?"

**HOT POTATO SALAD WITH "FRANKS"**

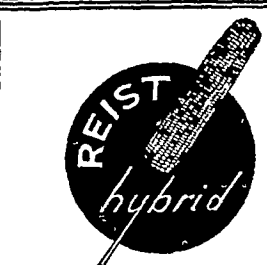
- 6 medium unpeeled raw potatoes (about 5 cups) water.
- 1½ cups (large can) undiluted evaporated milk
- ½ cup vinegar
- 4 strips uncooked bacon
- 1 pound frankfurters, cut in half
- ½ cup chopped onion
- ½ cup chopped green pepper
- 1 tablespoon flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons sugar

Place potatoes in saucepan. Cover with water. Cook until tender. Cool. Peel and slice. Slowly add vinegar to evaporated milk stirring constantly until smooth. Cut bacon in small pieces. Cook in frying pan over low heat until golden brown. Remove bacon from pan. Brown the frankfurters in bacon fat. Remove "franks" from pan. Saute onion and green pepper in remaining bacon drippings. Add flour, salt and sugar. Stir until smooth. Gradually add milk-vinegar mixture. Cook until mixture is hot, stirring constantly. (Do not boil.) Add bacon & sliced potatoes. Heat to serving temperature (about five minutes). Serve with browned frankfurters. Makes 4 to 5 servings.
