Compared with last week's close, slaughter steers were 50-100 higher. Canner and Cutter cows 25-50 lower, Utility 75 lower. Bulls steady. Stockers and feeders fully steady.

New Holland Light Steers Are Higher

Slaughter steers grading low choice and below and weighing under 1,200 pounds were 50 higher at the June 29 auction at New Holland. Compared with last week's market all other steers were steady. Cows were 50 lower and bulls were strong. Receipts included 972 cattle.

Several lots of high choice and prime 950 to 1250 pound slaughter steers were 24.35 to 24.85. Choice 950 to 1300 pound steers brought 22.75 to 24.25, while 1,300 to 1,400 pounds made 22.25 to 23.60. Good to low choice sold at 21.50 to 23.50 and Standard was down to 20.25.

A few lots of good grade 730 to 913 pound heifers made 20.35 to 22.35.

Cutters and utility cows brought 17-17.75. Canners & low cutters were 15.50-17.00 with shelly cannery down to 12.50.

Utility and commercial spring lambs 65-100 lb. 16.50-18.50 Cull to choice sh. slaughter ewes 3.50-7.00.

Receipts included 144 cows 12 bulls and seven heifers. Fresh Holstein cows brought \$300-445 while Guernsey breeds \$175-290. Stock changed hands at \$85-\$175 and Stock heifers sold the block at \$60-175.

At the June 26 auction horses, ponies and mules market was steady to stronger. All mules continued to go to the killer trade. Receipts included 206 head.

Mare ponies brought \$255 with geldings going \$50-135. Riding horses \$135-285 and driving horses \$135-210. Killers 9 1/2 to 10 cents.

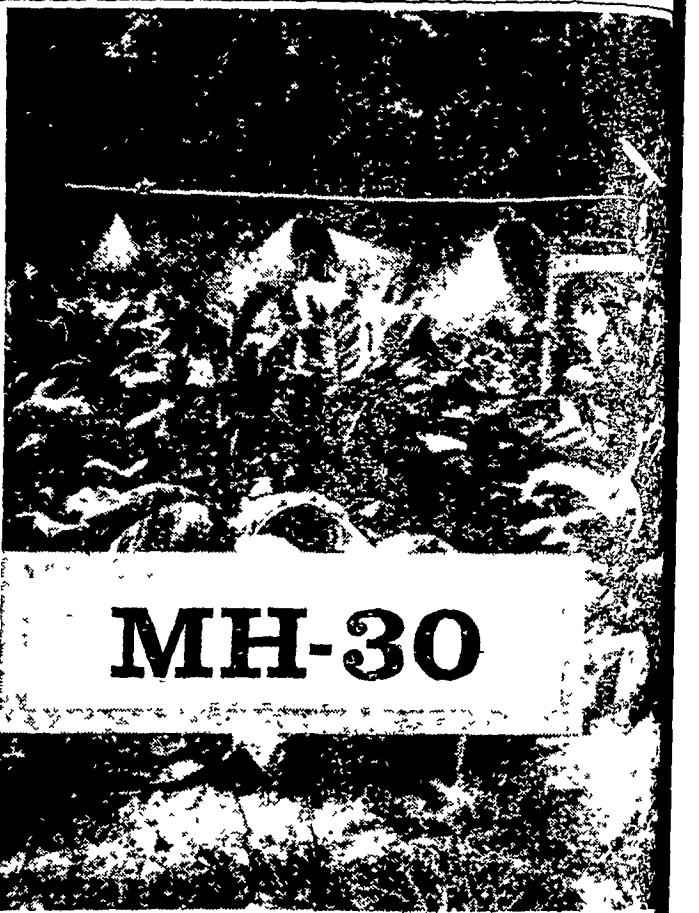
