## GROW SUMMER PASTURE

Sudangrass is our most productive summer annual pasture crop. John Baylor, Penn State extends on agronomist, says it can be planted between late May and late June. One acre will supply excellent grazing for three or four mature animals during July and August. Piper is a recommended variety.

## NEED RICH SOIL

If you're planning to plant vine crops such as cucumbers, squash, pumpkins and muskmelons, you'll find they do best on a rich loam soil containing plenty of organic matter, explains James Dutt, vegetable extension specialist. The vine crops also need plenty of fertilizer and control of insects. If irrigation is needed, do it in daytime.

Since June is National Dairy Month, this meeting was the annual ice cream party.

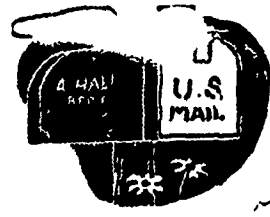
Roll call was a report on projects.

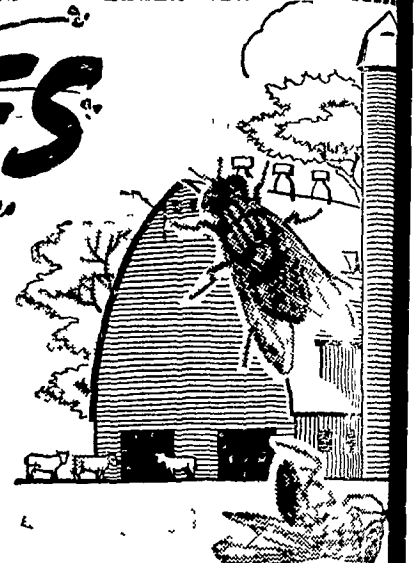
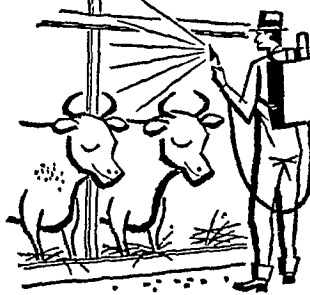
