(From page 1) ier and four per cent below a vear ago.

Mainly responsible for the May to June decilne were lower poultry, egg and whole sale milk prices Also contributing to the drop were slightly lower prices for most crops and all livestock, with the exception of cows which averaged 30 cents a hundredweight higher.

The index of prices received, the barometer of farm income, was 214 per cent of the 1910-14 base of 100. This compares with 217 a month earlier and 223 a year ago.

The parity ratio — the comparison of prices paid by farmers for goods and services to the price received for farm products-has declined every month since December 1960 and now stands at 71 per cent compared with 81 per cent in that month. Nationally, the parity ratio is 78 per cent, 1 per cent under last year.

The average price of eggs was down 2 cents a dozen from last year, the price of broiler chickens was down 2 cents a pound, and the blend price of wholesale milk was 5 cents a ćwt. below last year.


