

At Lancaster Yards Trading Fairly Active

CATTLE: 3300 compared to 2918 head last week. Supply included 50 percent slaughter steers and 40 percent stockers and feeders. Compared with previous weeks close: Trading fairly active on slaughter classes. Slaughter steers under 1200 lbs steady, weights over 1200 unevenly steady to 25 lower. Cows 25 lower, Bulls steady, instances 50 higher on Good grade Stockers and feeders slow throughout week about steady.

Slaughter Steers. High - Choice and Prime 1100-1300 lbs. 23 75 24 50, bulk Choice 950-1250 lbs 22 50-24 00, Good and low-Choice 21 50-22 75, Standard 20 00-21 75.

HOGS: 1200 compared to 1534 head last week. Barrows and gilts 50-75 lower. Sows scarce, steady.

Vintage Livestock Steers Steady To 50 Lower

Cattle receipts at the July 18 Vintage Auction totaled 600 head. Compared with last week's market, slaughter steers steady to 50 lower, decline largely on high-choice and better grades. Cows steady, instances 50 lower. Bulls steady to 50 lower.

Few lots choice and prime slaughter steers 24-24.35, choice 900-1300 lbs 22-24, 1300-1400 lbs 21 50-22 50. Good to low-choice 21.50-23. Standard 19.50-21.50.

Small supply good and choice 725-925 lbs. heifers 20-22 75.

Cutter and utility cows at 16-17 25, canners and low-cutters 15.25-16 50. Shelly canners down to 12 60. Utility and commercial bulls at 19 50-22.50. Few at 22 85.

CALVES: 404. Compared with last week's market, vealers steady Good and choice vealers 27-32, choice and prime 32-34 50, few individuals 35.50 Standard and low-good 24-28, utility 21-24 50.

HOGS: 157. Compared to last week's market, barrows and gilts steady U.S. No. 1-2 grade 182-202 lb. barrows and gilts 19.35-19 60, U.S. 1-3 188-229 lbs. 18 85-19 50.

SHEEP: 14. Not enough spring slaughter lambs on sale to establish price trends or quotations.

New Holland Steers Steady to Up 50

Cattle receipts at the July 20 auction at New Holland totaled 1041 head. Compared to a week ago, slaughter steers steady to 50 higher. Cows 50 lower. Bulls steady.

Few lots Prime grade slaughter steers 24 75-25 00, Mixed high-Choice & Prime 24 00-24 50, Choice grade 950-1300 lb 22.50-24 00; 1-300-1400 lb 22.00-23., Good and low Choice 21 00-23 50, Standard 19.75-22 00.

Few lots Standard & Good heifers 19 00-21 85. Cutter & Utility cows 16.75-17 50, Canners and low-Cutters 15.00-16.75, Shelly Canners down to 12 50 Utility and Commercial Bulls 19 50-22 50.

CALVES: 311. Vealers unevenly steady to 1 00 higher. Good and Choice vealers 28-33, Choice and Prime 33 00-35 00, Few 36.00, Standard and low-Good 23 00-28 00, Utility 21 00-24.50 400.

The market was very active and higher on all top fresh Holstein cows but very slow on all other kinds at the July 19 sale. Receipts included 179 cows, 17 stock bulls and 25 stock heifers.

Fresh Holstein cows made \$300 to \$520 while Guernseys brought \$175-240 and other breeds sold for \$175-310. Stock bulls crossed the block at \$110-185 and stock

heifers changed hands at \$120. The market remained steady on-horses when 240 crossed the block at the July sale. Mules continued to trade to the killer trade.

Pony mares brought \$80-170 while geldings made \$80-130. Riding horses brought \$135-250 and driving horses ranged from \$130-220. Killers brought 8 1/2 to 9 cents.
