Broilers Hit New Low

Broiler prices made another record this week at Poultry Center, but it is the kind of record poultrymen are likely to brag about. Prices dropped to an all-time low of 12.62 average for 100 head in 19 lots. Only three lots of 100 broilers were not at the bids of 12.5 and two lots containing 1,450 broilers brought prices of 12.18. Three lots of 2,400 broilers made 100 to 100 while two lots of 1,000 broilers sold for 16.7. Following is the complete list with lot number, seller, variety in parenthesis, amount and breed, age in days and buyer and seller. The complete July 20 auction offered 78,675 head in 26 lots and sold 70,675 head in 26 lots.

Delmarva - Georgia

Broilers Drop Below 11 Cents

Delmarva reported live poultry supplies were ample for the current needs. Prices reported during the 24 hour period ending 10.30 Friday morning ranged from 10.80 to 12.30 per pound for 1,007,000 broilers at farms. Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the weekend was 818,000 head compared with the 752,000 head last week end. The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on July 14 was steady with the previous week at 3.0. During the week broilers averaged 14.01 and mash cost \$93.57 per ton. During the previous week, broilers were down to 13.99 but feed was slightly lower. For the corresponding week last year the ratio was up to 4.2 when broilers averaged 19.41 and mash cost the grower \$91.80 per ton. Georgia reported prices of 10 to 12 1/2, mostly 11, on 1,900,000 head at farms during the period. Estimated slaughter by Georgia processors during the week end was 2,122,000 head compared to 2,320,000 head last weekend. When on pasture, pig creeps should be located near the sleeping quarters, say University swine researchers.


