Broilers Up 2 1/2 Cents

Prices jumped almost a half cent a pound this week as 41,350 lots changed at prices of 144 to a sale average of the average last week 65, but the prices week reflected the shown in the Delmarva area earlier. At the corresponding last year broiler sale 1904.

Broilers on offer were at two lots of roast not sold at the bids and 170. One lot of broiler roasters sold and two lots of 1,800 broiler roasters brought 152.

Lot of 4,640 leghorn four lots made 975 while a lot of 850 broiler brought 15 and bid for 8 cents for head.

Delmarva - Georgia

Clearing Readily At Higher Prices

Delmarva reported prices of 13.7 to 14.8 for 586,100 head sold during the 24 hr. period ending 10:30 Friday morning. Offerings cleared readily to the relatively heavy demand.

Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the week end was 869,000 head compared to the 818,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending July 21 was down three pts. from the previous week at 2.7. Broilers averaged 12.55 per pound and mash cost \$93.62 per ton. For the comparable week a year ago the ratio was 4.0 when the broilers brought 18.26 and mash cost \$91.93 per ton.

Fluid Milk Production Drop Fairly General

Fluid milk production declined at a greater or lesser degree throughout the country except for some of the south Atlantic areas where flow continues well sustained.

In the North Atlantic states supplies were tightening up due in part to prior commitments to manufacturers. Bottling demand was irregular generally steady to good, mostly of a seasonal nature. Very light supplies now available except in the Atlanta area where heavy diversion to cheese plants continues in the mid-west.

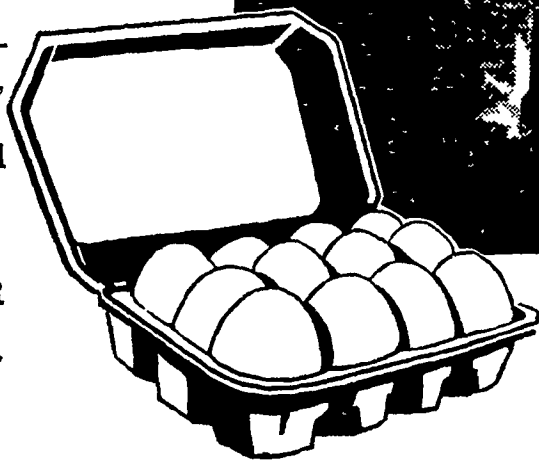
