

Broilers Continue Up

Broilers took another jump week at the Lancaster Poultry Center as 77,300 birds in 17 lots crossed the scale at prices ranging from 17.10 for a sale average of 16.10. The average for the week was 16.05 and the week before that 12.65. The average for corresponding sale last week was 18.25.

Three lots of Leghorn fowl were sold from 9.0 to 10.3 for 1,990 head. One lot of heavy fowl brought 14.5 for one lot of 1,250 roasters made 19.2. Fifty males for 80 cents per pound.

The entire August 3 auction offered 103,015 birds in lots and sold 22 lots containing 815 head. All broilers offered were sold. The birds not sold were bid to 18.5.

Delmarva-Georgia Clearing Readily At Higher Prices

Live prices in Delmarva during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning ranged approximately 1/2 cent higher. The volume of offerings was not heavy but generally considered ample for processing needs.

Prices paid during the period ranged from 14.6 to 15.9 for 719,600 head at farms

Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the weekend was 674,000 head compared to the 869,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on July 28 was up one point at 2.8. Live broilers averaged 13.56 and mash cost the grower \$93.85 per ton. The ratio for the comparable week a year ago was 4.0 when broilers brought 18.03 and mash cost \$90.49 per ton.
