

## Best Food Buys Prices For Budget Watchers

Foodshoppers—with an eye for holding down the food budget will find a wide variety of bargain priced items at most markets this week and, reports Tom Piper, Penn State Extension Marketing Agent

Beef continues to lead the parade of values at the meat counter. Forequarter beef is in heavy supply, setting up the popular hamburger and chuck roasts as clear cut-market values. Arm or chuck steaks treated with commercial tenderizers provide economy and good eating, something to consider for that next cookout.

Turkeys and broiler-fryers

continue as economical choices at the meat counter. Fresh pork prices remain firm while hams, picnics and bacon will be featured at reasonable prices in many food-markets. Pork supplies will increase as we enter the fall months and prices will be lower then. Wholesale egg prices moved lower again as hot weather retarded demand, this item remains on the list of good food buys.

Late summer supplies of fresh vegetables are coming to market now, providing a wide choice to food shoppers. Snapbeans, cabbage, sweet corn, lettuce, celery, cucumbers, eggplant, peppers, sum-
