Hay Show Set Entries Asked

Hershey, Pa., Aug 4 — Samples of the best hay crops produced this year in Southeastern Pennsylvania compete for the championship of a 16 county district at the sixth annual South-east Hay Show, Aug 24-26 at Hershey. The hay will be displayed under tents in the stadium. The show will be a feature of Hershey's Pennsylvania Dutch Days.

Dr. John E. Baylor, extension agronomist at the Pennsylvania State University, Chairman of the hay show today said it will embrace the counties of Adams, Berks, Bucks, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Delaware, Franklin, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Montgomery, Philadelphia, Northampton, York and Schuylkill.

Entries close at 10:30 a.m. Aug. 24 and judging will start at 1 p.m. The judge will be W. H. Hosterman, Washington, D. C. hay expert with the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Hay will be shown in two sections—heat cured & field cured. A champion will be named in each section, and the better of these two will be designated grand champion of the show.

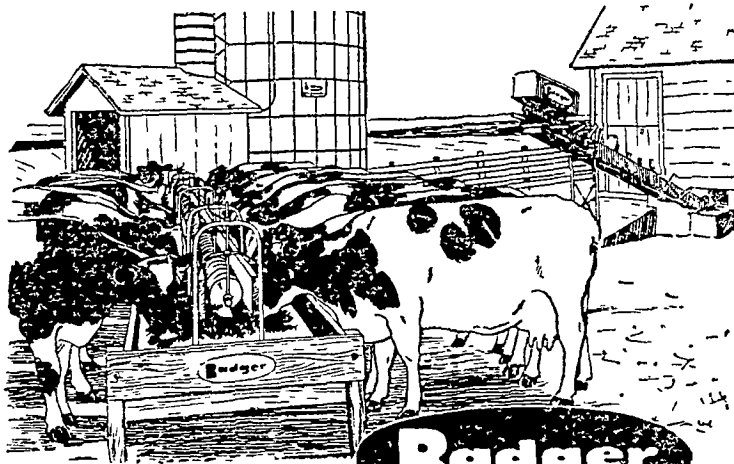
