

Queen Contest One Feature Of Solanco Fair Program

In addition to the many agricultural exhibits and displays, the 1961 Solanco fair will feature a parade, band concert, youth contest and a Harvest Queen pageant. Jno Hoffman, fair association president said this week.

The selection of a Harvest Queen will mark the opening of the fair, to be held September 20 to 22 on the Fire Company grounds in Quarryville.

The queen will be chosen from a list of seven candidates elected by the student body of the Solanco High School. Among other activities, the candidates will participate in a talent contest. The queen will be chosen from the group on the basis of audience applause, but each contestant will be awarded a prize.

The Solanco High School band, under the direction of Ralph Downey, will furnish the entertainment for the Thursday night program.

Friday's activities include a baby parade at 10 a.m., a fashion show at 2 p.m. and the annual fair parade of bands, floats, marching units and the harvest queen and her court, beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Entertainment at 8 p.m. on the fair grounds will be fol-

lowed by the presentation of the youth prizes with winners chosen on the basis of entries and prizes won by the contestants.

Judging of the agricultural exhibits will take place during Wednesday and Thursday as determined by the directors of the fair.
