PULLETS NEED LIME

Growing pullets need lime for building strong bones and later for producing strong egg shells. That's why F. H. Leuschner, Penn State extension poultry specialist, suggests keeping a hopper of shell-making material before the birds at all times after they are six weeks old.

WEEKLY REVIEW — Cattle—Local receipts little changed from last week but distribution altered with the smallest Monday supply since late May.

Slaughter steers 150-250 higher with wgt's over 1200 lbs largely 2 - 250 higher, heifers 1-150 higher, cows and bulls 25 to mostly 50 higher, other classes scarce.

Load prime 1225 lb steers 26 50, several loads of mostly prime 1250-1325 lbs. 26-25 Bulk choice and prime 900-1475 lb steers 23-26, largely 25-26 at the close.

Bulk good 900-1350 lb 22-24 25, mostly 23 up late when mixed good and choice these wgt's. sold at 23 75-25. Utility and standard 20 50-22 50.

Load mostly prime 950 lb. heifers 25, bulk choice 22 75 to 24 25, largely 23 50 up late with several loads high choice and mixed choice and prime 900-1050 lbs 24 25-24 50. Good 21 50-23 25 Utility and standard 18-21 75 at the close.

Cutter, utility and commercial cows 14-17 25, late-canner largely 13-15 25 Utility and commercial bulls 18-21 at the close. Good and choice vealers 22-27, culls down to 10.

Few medium and good 750-900 lb feeding steers 20 50-23, small lot choice 800 lb 24.

Several lots of high choice and prime grade slaughter steers brought 25 75-26 35.

Choice grade at 900 to 1,350 pounds sold for 24-25-75. Good to low choice made 22 50 to 24. Standard brought 21-22 50.

A few lots of good to choice heifers weighing 800 to 1000 pounds brought 22 35 to 24.

Cutter and utility cows made 15 75 to 16 85 while cannery and low cutters were 14 50 to 15 75 and shelly cannery sold down to 13.

Utility and commercial bulls cleared at 19 50 to 22 50.

Calves 304 Vealers were steady to weak. Good and choice vealers brought 27 to 32 with choice and prime at 32 to 35 50. Standard and low good made 24-27 with

utility 20-24. A few lots 80 to 100 pounds brought 18 50 to 21.

The August 9 sale of cattle had a very slow market on all kinds. Receipts included 174 cows, stock bulls and 10 heifers.

Fresh Holstein cows brought \$300-445, Guernsey \$175-225, and other breeds sold for \$175-280. Bulls brought \$110-175, stock heifers sold for \$150.

The August 7 sale of ponies and mules very slow. All mules continued to go into the trade. Receipts were head.

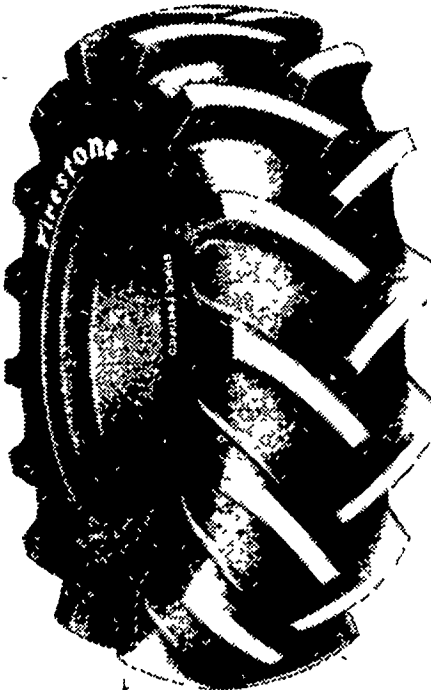
