In addition to the 43 head of halter-broke steers exhibited in the show, 13 head of steers in the club were sold at the sale in the afternoon even though they could not be shown in the judging ring. Top price for the Frey champion was \$50 per hundredweight paid by R. P. Howery, Lancaster R7. In the sale last year Rhoda Mast, Everson R2, saw her grand champion bid in at \$2 per hundredweight.

Receive champion steer was purchased by Schluderberg and Kurde Co., Baltimore for \$40 per hundredweight. To a weight of the 16 steers in the club was \$220 pounds for which club members received a total of \$15,384.27 or an average of \$28.37 per pound including the two champions. The steers averaged 968 lb.

Richard Eberle, driver of the truck, showed the group how he stores and distributes up to 38,000 ampules of frozen semen to inseminators in the northeastern states in a nine day period.
