Light Bulbs Out of Water
 A dirty light bulb, moist is easy, when you dunk it Dunking in the cement base to the glass ventilation. Otherwise, with bulb with damp, remove suds, taste Leftover cake may all before return to socket

'Ventilate Your Cakes'
 Keeping cakes tasty and moist is easy, when you know the secret Store your cakes in closed containers, but be sure there's a little ventilation. Otherwise, with some air circulation, cakes soon acquire a musty taste Leftover cake may all be frozen Always pack-age carefully in moisture

and vapor-proof freezer bags or freezer foil.

Stale Bread Still Useful
 Don't throw out that partial loaf of stale bread. "Revive" it, and trim your food bill For fresh-baked taste, put stale bread in paper bag sprinkling with warm water if very stale Close bag tightly, and place in 350 degree oven from 10 to 15 minutes—and then serve piping hot Bread also can be stored in the refrigerator to prevent mold from forming

Summertime can mean heavy overtime for your refrigerator When a refrigerator door is left open unnecessarily, warm moist air enters, and excess frost builds up causing the appliance to work harder and longer.

Cool 'Hot' Utensils First
 Here's a tip on keeping your metal cooking utensils looking like new After using, allow a few minutes for cooling before soaking them Otherwise, they may warp from too rapid change in temperature

Close That Refrigerator Door

All Drivers CAN Save Gasoline

You don't have to buy a compact car or a foreign small make to save on gasoline, says Keystone Automobile Club, you can do it with your own car by following these suggestions offered by Samuel T. Milliken, Keystone's Service Manager

- 1 Drive at moderate speeds Gas mileage is 52 per cent less at 80 mph than 30
- 2 Avoid fast starts A "jack rabbit" start uses twice as much gas
- 3 Don't make unnecessary stops Acceleration from stops may cost one gallon in three
- 4 Maintain steady speeds. A steady 50 mph is 25 per cent more economical than varying from 30 to 70 mph
- 5 Keep brakes adjusted Dragging brakes can cost five miles per gallon in mileage
- 6 Check tire inflation Under-inflated tires cost money
- 7 Keep your engine in tune An improperly tuned engine could use twice as much fuel.

Through these tips, he concluded, it is estimated that you can increase your gas mileage 10 to 20 per cent
