

AVOID ANIMAL INJURIES KEEP APPLE QUALITY

Safe livestock handling can reduce hazards to both the stockman and animals. Thomas King, Penn State extension livestock specialist, points out that common sense and adequate handling equipment are both essential in working with livestock. This is particularly important when animals are moved about for exhibit and judging at summer fairs.

Harvesting apples at the right stage of maturity will do more to lengthen their storage life and prevent scald than artificial aids, says Carl S. Bittner, Penn State extension pomologist. Quality and appearance are influenced also by the color of the fruit, condition of trees, and kind of containers used for storage.

STILL TIME TO PLANT

Late August is still planting time in the home garden for a few crops, such as endive, kale and Chinese cabbage, reminds James O. Dutt, Penn State extension vegetable gardening specialist. Even September 1 is not too late for spinach, lettuce, and early-maturing radishes. He suggests sowing the seed thinly, and thin again when the plants come up, if necessary.

PROTECT SEED QUALITY

Clarence S. Bryner, Penn State extension agronomist, suggests storing seed grains in properly fumigated bins to protect seeds from rats and insect pests.
