Slaughter Steers Weak

CATTLE 3906 compared to 3608 last week. Trading slow. Supply includes 40 percent slaughter steers, 50 percent stockers and feeders. Compared with last week's close, slaughter steers weak to 50 lower. Cows 25 higher. Bulls fully steady. Stockers and feeders strong. Choice grade 900-1300 lb slaughter steers 24 00-25 50, few lots & load high-choice and prime 903-1234 lb 26 00-26 10, Good to low-choice 22 75-24 00, Standard 21 50-22 75. Lot 876 lb high-choice heifers 24 50. Cutter and Utility cows 16 50-17 50, few to 17 75, Canners and low-Cutters 15-16 50, shelly Canners down to 13 00. Utility and Commercial bulls 19 50-22 50, Good grade 22 00-23 50. Good and Choice 800-1050 lb feeder 23 00-25 50, few loads Choice 1050-1154 lb 23 25-24 00, 26 00, lot Common 800 lb 19 50. Good grade 450-550 lb stock calves 25 00-27 50, few lots Choice 26 00-28 50.

CALVES 675 compared to 598 last week. Trading moderately active. Vealers fully steady. Good & Choice vealers 27 00-33 00, Choice and Prime 33 00-36 00, some at 37 00. Standard and low-Good 23 00-27 00, Utility 21-22 00.

HOGS 1100 compared to 1179 last week. Trading moderately active. Barrows and gilts opened strong to 25 higher but at the close of week only steady. Sows steady. Barrows and Gilts: S 1-2 190-220 lb. 20 75, 1 190-220 lb 21 00-21 50, mostly 21 00, 1-3 190-230 lb 19-75-20 00, 19 50-19 75 late, 2-3 19 50, 230-250 lb mostly 2-3 19 00-19 50. U. S. 1-3 mostly 2-3 300-600 lb. sows 12 00-15 00.

SHEEP 475 compared to 468 last week. Trading moderately active. Quality very poor. Spring-slaughter lambs steady. Good and Choice 60-95 lb spring lambs 16 00-19, Choice and Prime 19 00-20 50. Lot Prime 93 lb 20 75, Utility 13 00-16 00.

Vintage Livestock Most Kinds Fully Steady

Cattle receipts at the August 22nd auction at Vintage included 446 head. Compared with last week's market, slaughter steers grading average, choice, and below 25-50 lower, few high-choice and prime steady, with lesser quality and fills considered. Cows 25-50 higher. Bulls steady.

Few high-choice and prime grade slaughter steers at 25 60-26 10, choice 900-1275 lb. 23 75-25 50, good to low-choice 22 50-24, standard at 20 50-22 50.

Cutter and utility cows 16 50-17 50, few to 17 75, canners and low cutters 15-16 50, shelly canners down to 13. Utility and commercial bulls 20-22 50.

CALVES 400. Vealers 1 higher. Good and choice vealers 28-34, choice and prime 34-38, standard and low-good 24-28, utility 21-24, few 85-100 lb 18-21.

HOGS 248. Barrows and gilts 50 lower. U. S. 1-3 178-224 lb barrows and gilts at 18 85-19 35, 1-2 197-217 lb 19 50-19 75. Few lots No. 1 202-215 lb. 20-20 35, lot 1-2 232 lb. 19 85.

SHEEP 47. Not enough of any class on sale to establish a market. Few utility spring lambs 13-15.

New Holland Active and Steady

Cattle receipts at the August 24 auction totaled 1007 head at New Holland.

Compared with last weeks market, slaughter steers steady. Cows steady. Bulls fully steady. Few high-choice and prime grade slaughter steers 25.85-26. Choice 950-1300 lb. 24-25 75, good to low-choice 23-24. Standard 21-22.

Cutter and utility cows at 16 25-17 35, canners and low cutters 14 75-16 25, utility and commercial bulls 19 50-22 50. Good and choice mostly good 569-790 lb stock steers 22 60 - 24 25, mostly good 870-940 lb feeder steers 22 10-23.

CALVES: 425. Vealers steady. Good and choice vealers 28-33, choice and prime 33-36 50, standard and low good 24 50-28, utility 21-25, few 85-100 lb 19-21.

The market continued to be steady and active at the August 23 sale of dairy cattle when 167 cows, 10 bulls and 19 heifers crossed the block.


Fresh Holsteins brought \$300-445, Guernseys made \$175-250 and other breeds \$175-310. Stock bulls sold for \$125-207 and stock heifers ranged from \$110-150.

At the August 21 sale of horses mares were \$110-185, geldings, \$50-141; riding horses \$130-240, driving horses \$130-210, and k.l.lers at 8½ to 9 cents.

Weekly Review - Cattle—Slaughter steers steady to 50 lower, heifers steady to 50 lower, cows 25-50 lower, bulls steady, other classes scarce.
