

## Lanc. Poultry Center

### Broilers Average 13.38

At the Lancaster Poultry Center Auction this week 85,225 broilers in 17 lots brought prices of 13.2 to 13.8 for an average of 13.38 compared with an average of 13.48 last week.

The complete sale offered 115,200 head in 43 lots and sold 95,800 head in 29 lots.

Five lots of 4,600 pullets made 17 to 20.4, while 5 lots of 4,625 roasters brought 16 to 18. One lot of 950 leghorn fowl brought 9.9 while one lot of 400 heavies 14.1.

## Delmarva-Georgia

### Prices Down About 1/2 Cent

Live broiler prices in Delmarva area were approximately 1/2 cent lower during the 24 hour period ending at 10.30 Friday morning. The decline was a reflection of the lower prices in competing areas.

Prices reported and sales made during the period ranged from 12 to 13.4 for 862,600 head at farms.

Offerings in Delmarva were ample for processing needs Eastern shore processors estimated their slaughter for the weekend at 840,000 head compared with the 830,000 last weekend.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on Aug. 19 was down 2 from the previous week. The ratio was 2.9 when broilers averaged 13.38 per pound and mash cost \$93.77 per ton. This compares with the 3.7 ratio for the same week a year earlier and 4.2 six months ago.

In the past two decades the average farmer has tripled his output per hour of work.
