Emergency Food Needs Outlined By CD Officials

What Americans need to know about providing food and water for survival at home or in a family fallout shelter, following nuclear attack, is told in a new U.S. Department of Agriculture publication

"Family Food Stockpile for Survival (HG-77) recommends a 2-week emergency supply of food and water for families to store and maintain a special emergency food stockpile or to build up their regular food stores so that there is always a 2-week supply on hand

The publication prepared by USDA's Agricultural Research Service in cooperation with the Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization, tells how to store and how often to replace food stockpiles and lists equipment needed for emergency cooking Sample menus show how to provide a reasonably balanced diet using these foods

Emergency foods should be in cans, jars or tightly sealed paper containers, preferably in sizes that will supply just enough for one meal the bulletin explains Foods should be selected that will last for months without refrigeration and that can be eaten with little or no cooking

A total of 23 herds had averages of 45 to 49 pounds.
