for processing and mailing the records for each cow is 9999 cents. This cost is nearly doubled each time a new cow is added to the herd.

In 1957 the directors of the Pennsylvania DHIA set up a fee of 10 cents per cow per month to cover the cost of processing records and pay off the cost of setting up the central accounting system. The fee was charged only on those cows in the herd on test day but it costs the association nearly 10 cents for every cow reported sold before test day. The directors felt charges should be brought in line with costs in order to retire the debt and put the program on a self-sufficient basis.

The directors also voted to notify any member when his payment of fees is one month in arrears and to instruct the testers to refuse to test the herd of any member who is two months in arrears until the member pays and keeps his fees current.

In other business, president Jay Land's appointed the following directors as a committee to set date and place of the annual banquet: Robert Hess, Strasburg R1, chairman, Robert McSparran, Peach Bottom, Graybill Gible Manheim R3

Head Tester Jay Risser was instructed to have the testers conduct an informal poll among the membership of the associations to see if farmers would be willing to hold the annual meeting at noon rather than at night. A report is to be made at the next directors meeting.
