Broilers Dredge Bottom

Broilers dredged bottom this week at the Lancaster Poultry Center when head in nine lots priced in price from 124 to 136 for a sale average of 128.7. Prices at Lancaster reflected the decline at Shelbyville Delaware where the sale average Thursday was 12.10. Lots ranged 14 to 163 for the 3000 head in three while 3000 cockerels in lots ranged 15 to 176. Lots of Leghorn fowl ranged 87 to 92 for the head while one lot of heavy fowl made 142.60 males brought eight per pound. The complete August 31 offered a total of 83460 in 28 lots and sold 60 head in 18 lots. The not sold were bid 26 and 12.7 while the sold roasters were bid to 23. Sellers Show Reluctance

Deimarva reported prices of 11.50 to 12.00 on purchases of 628,600 head at farms during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning. Live prices averaged approximately 1/2 cent lower with sellers exhibiting reluctance to the decreasing value by declining bids on the relatively large volume. The heavy offering continued fully ample for the needs of eastern shore processors who estimated slaughter for the week end at 782,000 as compared with the 748,000 head last week end. The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on August 25 was down 1 point at 2.8. Broilers averaged 13.06 cents per pound and mash cost the grower \$93.65 per ton. The ratio for the same week a year ago was 3.7 when broilers averaged 17.26 and mash cost \$92.42 per ton. The ratio six months ago was 4.1. Broilers at that time were bringing 18.81 cents per pound.

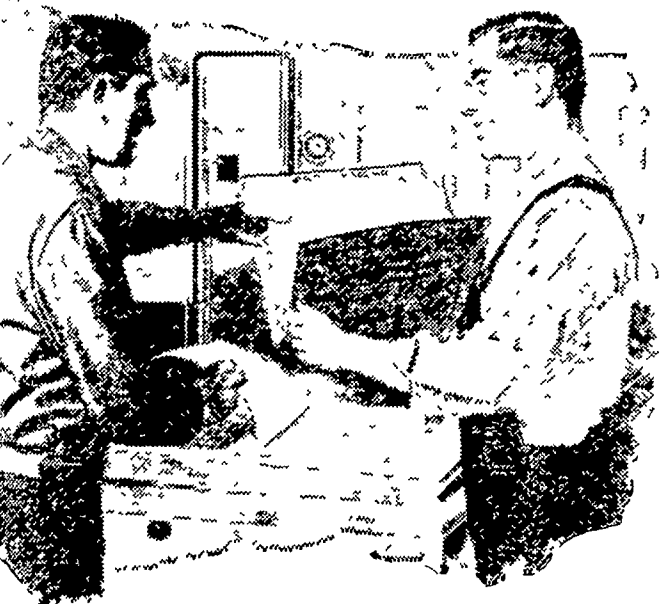
