New Booklet Describes
Penna.'s Agricultural Adjustment

"Agricultural Adjustment in Pennsylvania" is the subject of a new booklet recently published by the Agricultural Experiment Station of the Pennsylvania State University

The 32 page publication printed as the Summer 1961 issue of "Science For The Farmer" points out some of the major adjustments agriculture will be called upon to make as farming areas become more urbanized and industrialized

After an invitation to read the booklet, written by Dr Lyman Jackson, Dean of the College of Agriculture, an over-all view leads into the specific areas of Land Use, Forest Industry, Livestock, Dairy, Poultry, and Horticulture

Dean Jackson, in the introduction says We ask you to join in looking inward outward backward and most importantly of all Forward to assess and develop the agricultural program in Pennsylvania


