Near normal temperatures are expected during the next five days except slightly cooler Monday and Wednesday. Normal temperatures for the weck range from 51 at night to 72 in the afternoon. Piccipitation may total 0.1 to 0.5 inch falling mainly as showers Sunday night and again late in the period.
