

Houser Shows 2 Champs In Lampeter Swine Show

James Houser, Lampeter, carried home two grand champion rosettes and one reserve champion ribbon from the swine show at the Lampeter Fair, Wednesday.

Houser showed his Chester white sow to the Grand championship spot in the breeding hog show and went on to exhibit his medium-weight pen of four Chester White market hogs to the top spot in that division. The hogs averaged 200 lbs.

In the Pen of two market hogs, Glenn Book of Lancaster R7 took the top placing with two 225 pound Yorkshires. Houser had the reserve pen of two Chester White heavyweights

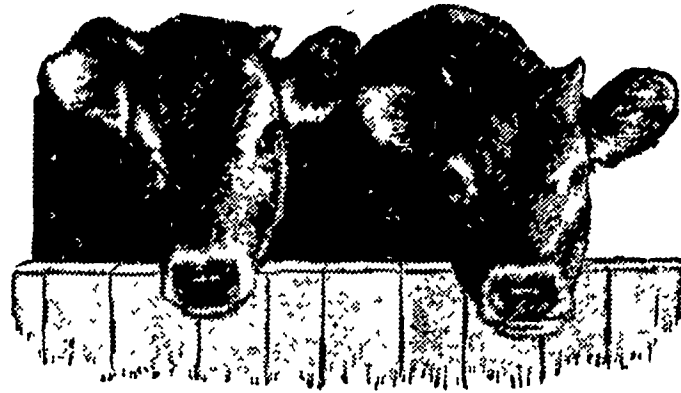
