**CATTLE.** 6300 Compared with 5714 last week Supply includes 15 per cent slaughter steers and 75 per cent stockers and feeders Trading slow on slaughter steers, but moderately active on all other classes Compared with last week's close slaughter steers were steady Cows 75 lower Bulls fully steady. Stockers and feeders steady This week so far has seen the largest supply of stockers and feeders on the market The supply being largely 800-1100 lb feeder steers with good demand for this type The quality of stock calves is only average with most calves grading Good to average Choice.

Slaughter steers lost some ground at the October 3 auction at the Vintage sales stables Slaughter steers were 25 to 75 lower compared to the previous week. Cows were 75 to 100 lower and bulls were 50 higher. Receipts included 705 head of cattle.

High Choice and Prime grade slaughter steers 25 60-26 25, Choice 900-1300 lb. 23 75-25 50, several 1300-1,400 lb 23 00-24 00 Good to low-Choice 22 25-23 75. Standard 20 50-22 25.

Cutter and Utility cows 15 25-16 50. Canners and low-Cutters 13 75-15 25. Shelly Canners down to 12 00.

Utility and Commercial bulls 20 00-22 50. Lot Good grade 647 lb stock steers 23 50 few lots Good grade 715-1000 lb. feeder steers 21 50-23 50.

Slaughter steers averaged 50 lower compared to the previous week's close at the October 5 auction at New Holland. Cows continued a bout steady Bulls were weak Receipts included 1071 head of cattle.

High choice and prime grade slaughter steers brought 25 60 to 26 00 with choice at 24-25.50. Good to low choice ranged 22 25 to 24. Standard made 21-22 25.

Cutter and utility cows brought 15 60 to 16 25 Canner and low cutters were 13 75-15.50 with shelly cannerners down to 12.

Utility and commercial bulls sold at 19 50 to 22 50 with good grade bulls up to 23 10

Medium and good 724-1093 pound feeder steers were 20 50-23.

**CALVES:** 425. Vealers weighing under 105 pounds were 1 to 2 higher Heavier wghts. were steady as good and choice made 28-34 and choice and prime 34-27 50 Standard and low good were 25-28. Utility 20-25.

The Dairy cattle market was improved this week as increased buying power was noted. Most of the advance came on top fresh cows Receipts at the October 4 sale included 152 cows; 7 bulls and 32 heifers.

Fresh Holstein cows made \$300-500 while Guernseys brought \$175-225 and other breeds sold at \$175-300 Stock bulls went to \$110-205 and stock heifers returned \$45 to \$135 to their owners

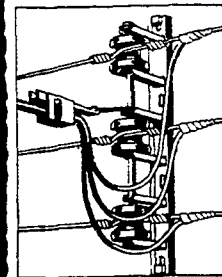
At the October 2 auction of horses, ponies and mules, killer horses were lower as were all other kinds except top quality saddle and driving horses. Receipts were 275 head.

Pony mares brought \$90-150 and geldings \$40-110 Riding horses were worth \$95-225, and Driving horses were \$110-270.
