200 started. Barred Rock capons purchased through the 4-H club program. Her project book total score finished third in the contest.

In second place in the exhibit scoring and in top place in the total project score was Gary Porter, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Porter, Washington Boro R1. A score of 99.75 out of a possible 100 points put Garry at the top of the 20 exhibitors in total project excellence. During his four years of participation in the capon club, Garry has never finished out of the placings, but this year marks the first grand prize. In last year's contest the 13 year-old student at Penn Manor High School finished second in the total project score phase of the show.

Garry's runner-up birds averaged just over 7½ lbs. and were the most uniform exhibit in the show, according to judge Carl Dossin, Extension Poultry Specialist from Pennsylvania State Uni-

versity. However, the birds lacked a little of the finish shown by the top exhibit.

Second in the total project book score with 99.25 points was Linda Stauffer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Maurice Stauffer, Lititz R3. Linda is a 14 year-old student at Manheim Township High School. Her birds were placed fourth in the exhibit judging.

Henry Menusan, extension entomologist will discuss the recent developments in applying insecticides with fertilizer and herbicides.

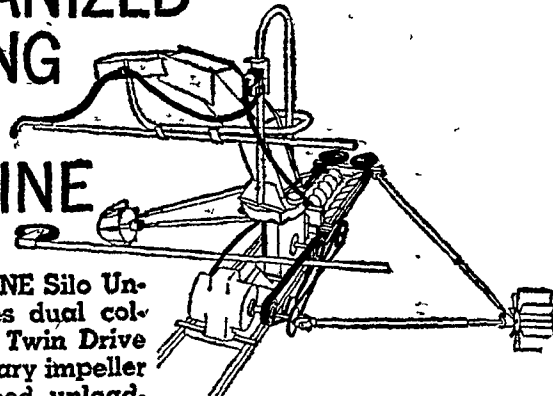
Extension agronomists and their subjects will include the following: James Eakin, The new soil test program and the meaning of the soil test; George Berggren, New weed

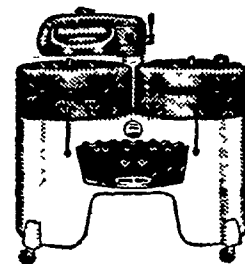

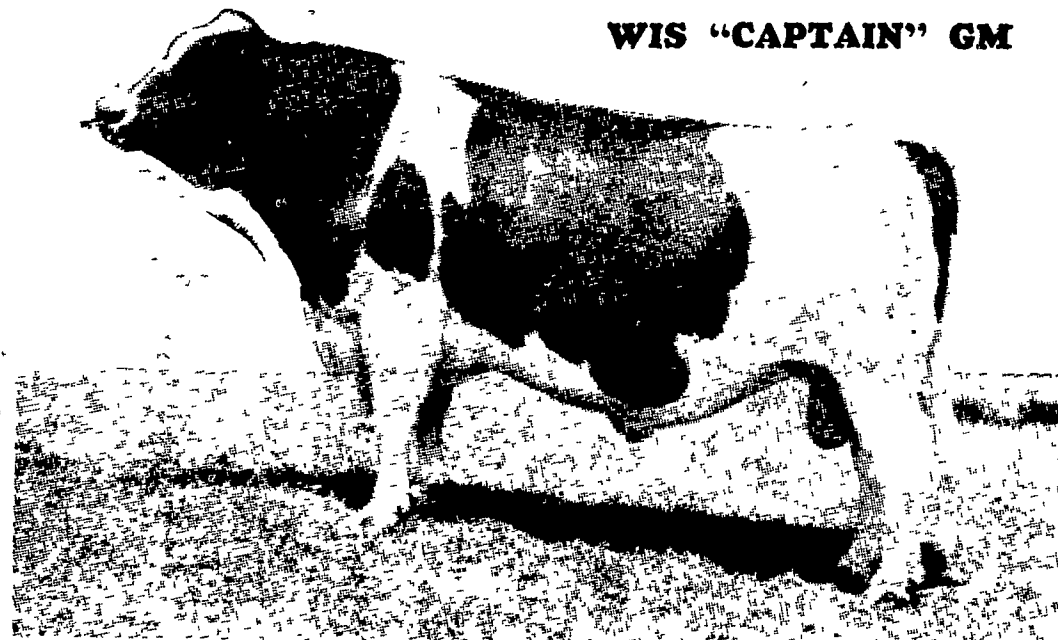
