**Price Plunge Slackens**

The downward plunge in broiler prices lost some of its momentum this week, but prices edged lower than the previous week. A total of 74,450 broilers in 15 lots sold at prices of 12.1 to 12.5 for a sale average of 12.30. The average last week was 12.38. Eight lots of broilers were not sold at the bids of 11 to 11.9.

Three lots containing 2600 roasters crossed the block at 21.5 to 21.6 while one lot of 800 pullets changed hands at 26.3, and two lots of 925 straight run roasters brought 21.5 to 22.5. Five lots of 5,200 heavy fowl made 13.1 to 13.3 while five lots of 5100 leghorn fowl sold for 11 to 9. A lot of 38 geese sold for 29.5 while 30 white rock fowl made 11.

Four lots of turkeys were not sold at bids of 20.1 and 20.4 for the toms and 26.2 and 26.3 for the hens.

The complete November 9 sale offered a total of 144,418 head in 48 lots and sold 99,743 head in 35 lots.

**Delmarva-Georgia**

**Prices Mostly**

**1/2 Cent Lower**

Because of the Veteran's Day holiday, Delmarva market reports were not available for Friday.

Delmarva reported prices of 11.70 to 13.40 during the 24 hour period ending 10.30 Thursday morning on 728,400 head at farms.

Live prices averaged approximately 1/2 cent higher for a fair to good demand for moderate supplies. Estimated slaughter for the day was 746,000 head compared with the 678,000 head for the same day last week.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending November 4 was down three points from the previous week at 2.7. Broilers averaged 12.38 per pound and 20 per cent broiler mash cost the grower \$90.82 per ton.

The ratio for the corresponding week a year ago was 3.8 when broilers sold for 16.50 per pound and mash cost \$87.12 per ton. Six months ago the ratio had dropped to 3.1 as the price of broilers slumped to 15.21 per pound.

**POPCORN SEASON**

Although most vendors look for popcorn that produces big kernels, the home popper is better off with smaller, but extra tender varieties, believes Mrs. LaRue Hefner, extension foods specialist at Penn State. Pop the corn either dry in a wire popper or in oil in a heavy skillet. The kernels will expand more than 30 times in size. One ounce of raw corn makes a full quart of popped corn.

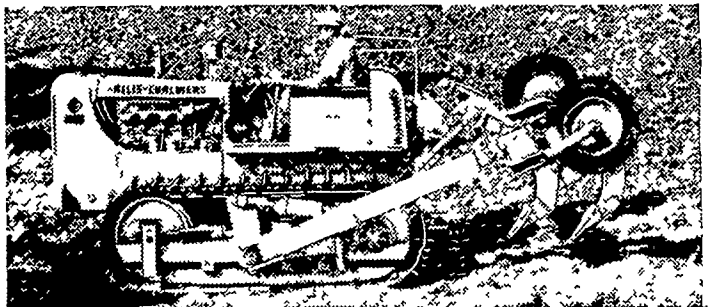

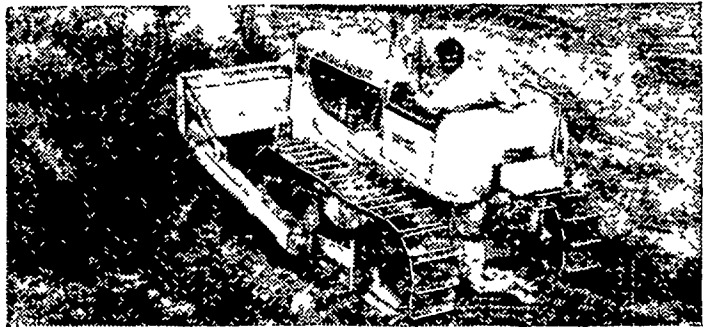
