SEND SOIL SAMPLES

September and October are two of the big soil testing months, and James H. Eakin, Jr., extension agronomist at Penn State suggests that soil samples be taken from sod fields to be planted to row crops next spring. Having soil tests made early aids both the farmer and the soil testing laboratory personnel. All samples must be submitted in special containers provided by the county agent.

More than 20 billion lbs of red meat are inspected and certified as wholesome each year. This includes 10.3 billion pounds of beef, 8.8 billion pounds of pork, 613 million pounds of lamb and mutton, and 604 million lbs of veal.

Compared with last week's market slaughter steers generally steady, spots strong on weights under 1100 lbs at the November 16 auction at New Holland. Cows fully steady. Bulls strong. Receipts included 955 cattle.

Prices continued about steady at the November 15 sale of dairy cattle. The run consisted of 135 cows, 18 bulls and 11 heifers.

Fresh Holstein cows sold \$350-475. Guernseys made \$175-250, and other breeds were \$175-310. Stock bulls brought \$115-215 and stock heifers were \$80-165.

Receipts of 326 head at the November 13 sale of horses, ponies and mules pushed the price on some kinds to \$10 per head lower. Good

saddle horses sold strong. Mules brought \$110-215 each. Pony mares were \$90-130 and geldings sold at \$40-100. Riding horses ranged from \$110-400 while driving horses were \$100-210. Killers were 7 1/2 cents per pound.

Chicago Cattle Receipts Least Since April

WEEKLY REVIEW - CATTLE—Local receipts smallest for any regular week since April 5 percent below a week ago and 7 percent below a year ago.

Slaughter steers opened the week as much as 50 higher but this was erased late Monday and Tuesday. Prices again higher late Wednesday and Thursday leaving slaughter steers steady to 25 higher than last weeks close with advance mostly on average choice and better Heifers 25-56 higher. Cows 50-75 higher. Bulls strong to 25 higher. Vealers and stockers and feeders steady.

On Monday three loads of prime 1200-1300 lb slaughter steers brought 27 50 but prices worked lower before the close and the top Wednesday topped at 27 25. Thursday, Load prime 1361 lb, reached 27 50 and this compared with a top of 27 00 a week ago. Late in the week bulk of the choice and prime 950-1400 lb 24 75-26 75. Most good (Turn to page 12)
