Compared with the previous week, slaughter steers were steady to 50 higher with most of the advance on the 1,100 pounds and heavier weights at the November 21 sale at Vintage. Cows were steady to 25 higher, spots 50 higher. Bulls steady. Receipts included 435 head.

Top Grades Fully Steady

The lighter holiday run at the November 23 auction at New Holland Sales Stables included 800 head of cattle. Compared with the previous week's sale, low choice and above were fully steady. Short fed cattle were steady to weak. Cows were steady and bulls were stronger, grade considered.

Few lots high-choice and prime 950-1100 lb slaughter steers 26 85-27 10, Bulk of the choice 25 00-26 25, few lots 26 35-26 75, Good to low choice 23 00-25 00, standard 21 50-23 00.

Few good and choice 800-1000 lb heifers 22 00-24 00.

Cutter and utility cows, 15 00-16 00, canner and low-cutter, 13 75 - 15 00. Shelly canners down to 11.00.

Utility and commercial bulls 19 50 22 50. Good grade up to 24 50. Several lots of good grade 666-852 lb. feeder steers 22 10-24 00.

CALVES 204 Vealers 1 higher. Good and Choice vealers 28.00-35.00. Bulk of the choice 35.00-38.00, Standard and low-good 24.00-28,

Utility 20 00-25 00. The November 22 sale of dairy cattle had receipts of 184 cows, 10 stock bulls and 24 stock heifers.

Market prices continued about steady as fresh Holsteins brought \$350-475 and Guernseys sold for \$175-210 and stock heifers brought \$80-165.

At the November 20 sale 168 head of horses, ponies and mules crossed the block at about steady prices.

Mare ponies sold at \$90-130 while geldings sold \$40-100. Mules brought \$110 to 215. Riding horses sold at \$110-350 and riding horses brought \$115-190. Killers were 7½ cents per lb.

Farmers' incomes have gone down during much of the postwar period, when non-farm workers have had an almost steady increase in income. Since 1945, the farm value of food has risen 16 percent. But the marketing margin is up 93 percent.

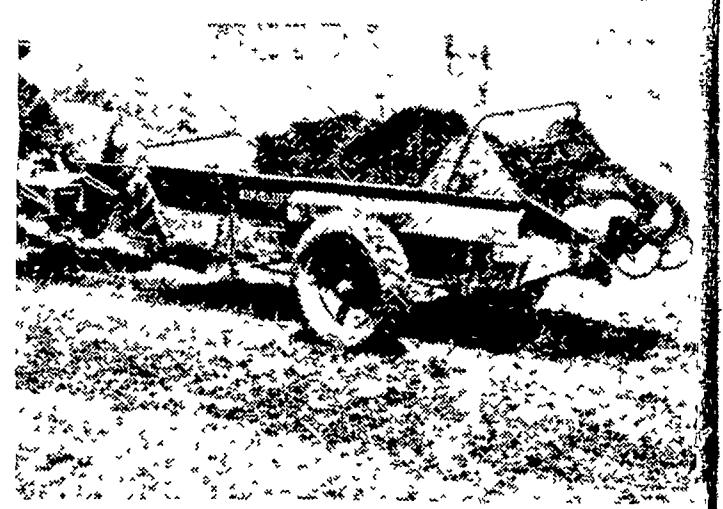
