At the sale during Wednesday afternoon Whitford Sales Company of Exton, Penna. purchased the grand champion on a bid of 60 cents per pound. The reserve champion went to Paul A. Stoltzfus, Bird-In-Hand for 39 cents per pound.

A total of 113,395 pounds of beef was sold for a total of \$32,471.13 for an average price, including the champions, of \$28.63½ per hundred weight. The price was less than a cent above the reported open market price in Chicago on Wednesday.

Average weight of all 116 steers sold was 977½ pounds.

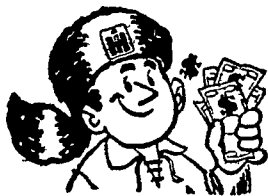

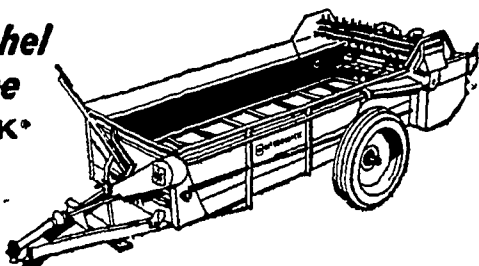

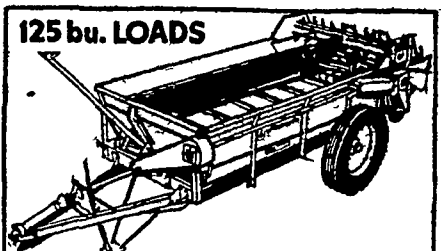
