### Farm Prices

year ago, nearly all prices were lower with the exception of cows, calves, sheep, and butterfat.

Prices received for all crops as a group averaged slightly above a month earlier but a full seven per cent below a year ago. Prices on grain and hay were higher but vegetable prices were lower.

During the month ended November 15, the index of prices received by farmers throughout the United States was down nearly one per cent, or about two points, to 238 per cent of its 1910-'14 average. Lower prices on meat animals, citrus fruit, corn, cotton and eggs were responsible for most of the decline.

The index of prices paid by farmers, including interest, taxes and farm wage rates remained at 301 per cent - the same as the preceding three months. It was the highest November index of record.

Before storing the fresh pork you buy, remove the tight store wrapping, reminds Louise Hamilton, Penn State extension nutrition specialist. If you won't be using the meat within a few days, wrap it loosely in waxed paper and put it in the refrigerator. Pork is highly perishable and must be refrigerated whether it is raw or pm cooked.
