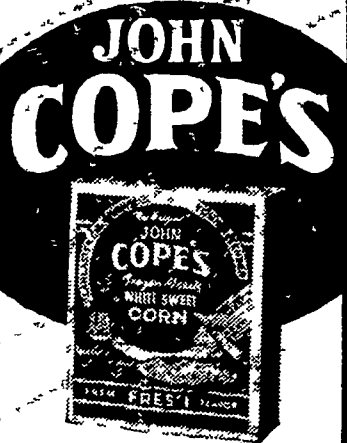

- 1½ teaspoons salt
- ¼ cup soft shortening
- 5¼ to 6½ cups sifted all-purpose flour
- 2 packages active dry yeast
- ½ cup warm water
- 1 cup rolled oats
- ½ cup raisins
- ½ cup chopped nuts
- 1 cup coarsely cut raw cranberries
- 1 teaspoon mace
- 1 teaspoon allspice
- 1 egg

Pour scalded milk into a large bowl with the sugar, salt and shortening. Add half the flour and beat until smooth. Add yeast to water and let stand 3 to 5 minutes. Stir to dissolve. Pour yeast into cooled milk-mixture with rolled oats, raisins, nuts, cranberries, spices, and egg. Stir in more flour a little at a time until dough cleans the sides of bowl and can be handled. Turn out onto cloth-covered board and knead about 5 minutes—until ball of dough feels springy under hand. Round up dough and place in greased bowl. Turn to grease all sides. Cover and let rise in warm place until dent remains when finger is pressed into sides of dough—about 1 hour. Meanwhile, grease 2 bread pans, 5x9x3-inches. Punch down raised dough. Turn out onto floured board, and divide in two. Round up into 2 balls and cover. Let rest 5 to 10 minutes, then shape into loaves. Place in the greased pans. Cover and let rise in warm place until doubled. Dent remains when finger is pressed lightly on side of dough. Preheat oven to moderate (350 degrees). Bake loaves 45 to 55 minutes, or until well browned on sides as well as tops. Remove from pans and cool on rack.

Venison Must Be Treated Carefully

By the end of this week about half a million Pennsylvanians will have been in the woods in hopes of bringing home a deer, observes Tom Piper, Penn State Extension Marketing Agent. In combined antlered and antlerless season, about one out of every seven hunters will be successful, if the 1961 deer kill averages what it has the last two years.

Although venison makes up a relatively small portion of the meat we use, about 1200 tons of the deer killed will be dressed. The disappointing thing about it is that a large quantity of it will never reach the dinner table. Venison that has been properly dressed, correctly cooked and attractively served is licious food.

- 1 cup commercial sour cream

Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Let chill until slightly thickened. Break up cranberry sauce with fork. Stir into gelatin with celery and walnuts. Fold in sour cream. Pour into a 1-quart mold and chill until firm. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

Selected pork cuts continue to provide good value because about 10 per cent more pork is coming to market now than a year ago. Many area markets featured pork loins and roasts last week; some markets indicate they will continue these specials this week. Other pork values to look for include fresh and smoked Boston butt, picnic shoulder, ham and bacon.

Many markets alternate this week-end specials between pork and beef so you may find chuck roast or round steak specials at your favorite store. Broiler-fryer supplies remain large for December and prices are attractive. Eggs continue to rate a very reasonable source of protein when compared with other sources on a per pound basis.

Rising prices are expected on many canned food prices in the next few months. Although supplies are sufficient to take care of our needs an increase in buying in the next 3 or 4 months is expected to send prices upward. One of the big factors that

may send consumers scurrying after more canned food is the continued unfavorable weather in the South Atlantic and Texas growing areas. Consumers are already buying more canned goods as fresh produce prices start their seasonal climb. If unfavorable weather prevails prices may go higher on fresh items causing food buyers to shift their buying to canned or frozen goods.

There is more storing of canned foods by families, institutional users and public centers as interest is increasing in the building of fall-out shelters. These various demands are taking an increasing quantity of food off the market.
