scotch tape. My difficulty in doing a good job of hoeing vegetables because they are planted in rows 18 inches wide instead of the way we do. (I don't know where to put my big feet)

I get a good hair cut over here for seven cents. And you ought to try to iron with one of these charred corn cob contraptions. Its like a regular iron except that it is about six inches high, filled with burning corn cobs that have been charred. But this is the way of life in Nepal.

By this time I have become adjusted to the food and have not had any trouble except that my head feels

The U. S. farmer produces enough to feed himself and 23 other persons, while the Russian farmer produces only enough to feed himself and another person.

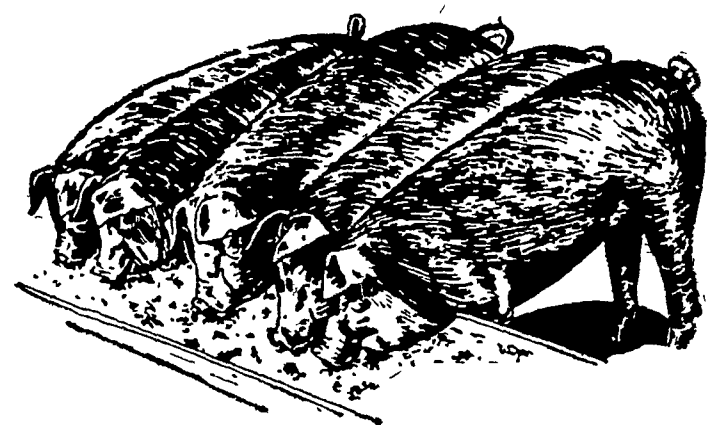

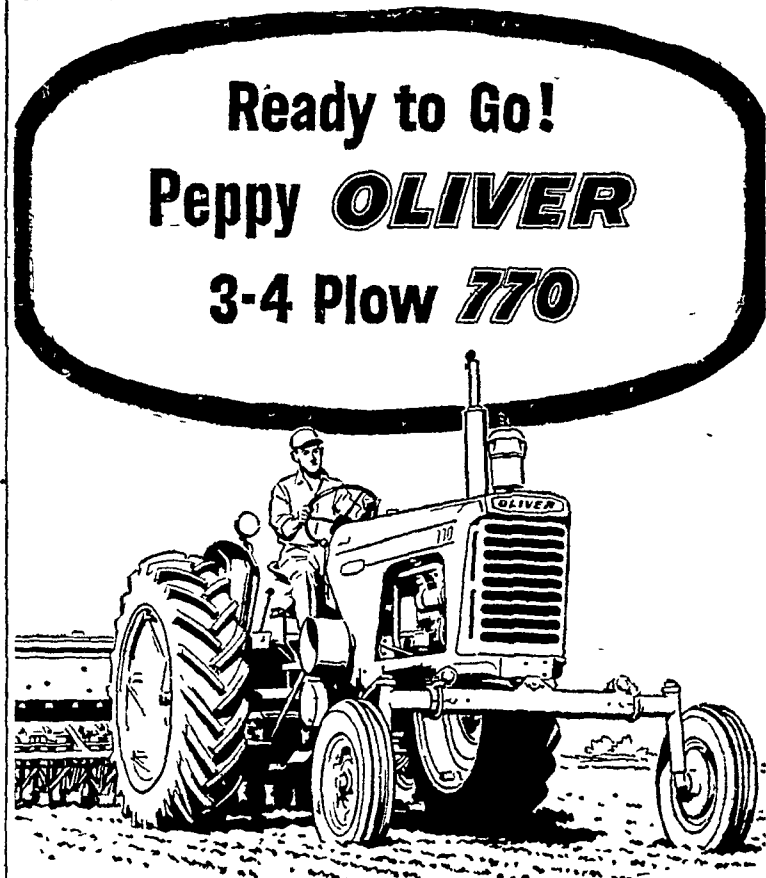
